10 Years of Culture

Brazos Valley Worldfest began in Downtown Bryan with about 25 culture displays and an estimated 3,000 attendees. Now the community cultural festival has expanded to Wolf Pen Creek Festival Field with more than 55 culture displays and a peak 13,000 attendees. Brazos Valley Worldfest will celebrate its 10th annual festival on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 4-5.

Brazos Valley Worldfest, organized by Texas A&M University and the City of College Station, is a nonprofit organization whose mission is to promote and celebrate the international diversity and heritage of the Brazos Valley. Since the inception of the festival, this mission has expanded from more than just a Saturday festival.

"The festival continues to expand to include Storytellers in Schools and Culture in the Classroom programs the week before the festival," says Kim Fox, festival coordinator. "Contact us now if you would like to have a storyteller or a culture presentation in your classroom this year. We hope to even include home school groups. We are also starting a Culture Club open to the community

to experience culture through cuisine and the arts. Programs will take place throughout the year."

The festival website is a great place to get updates on the event schedule as well as the other activities taking place throughout the year. For 2016, Brazos Valley Worldfest will be bringing back some of the most popular performers over the years including Kaminari Taiko

Drummers, Bandan Kora African Dance, Los Wranglers Tejano band and Ridna Shkola Ukrainian School of Houston to name just a few. The Franklin Safari petting zoo, Las Rebeldes riding group, and Hullabaloo Inflatables will be on site with fun activities as well.

In addition to performances on three stages, festival planners hope to have a record number of 60+ culture displays. Tour the park and visit countries and cultures from around the world while getting your souvenir passport stamped. Community groups are encouraged to participate and set up a culture display and demonstration. There is no charge to participate and tents and tables are provided. "We are looking to really bring in the community heritage groups this year to expand the offerings of the Texas A&M University student organizations," says Fox. "Not only heritage groups, but individuals or families are welcome to set up displays if it highlights a unique heritage."

Brazos Valley Worldfest is still looking for interested volunteers. Groups or individuals are welcome to apply. There is a background check and

To celebrate the Brazos Valley Worldfest 10th Anniversary, an official commemorative poster is being developed. Enrico will travel from Greifswald, Germany, along the Baltic Sea, to participate in Brazos Valley Worldfest. A number of sponsored events will occur for the community to meet Enrico. Leading up to the 2016 festivities, the commemorative posters – numbered/artist signed and unsigned, will be available for sale through the Bryan/College Station Sister Cities Association.
